The composer of today's work, Giovanni Battista Pergolesi (1710-1736) lived during the musical period we would now identify as the Baroque. The text is from *Luke 1:46-55*, and is thought of as a Canticle of the Virgin Mary. It may be interpreted as her personal expression of joy and thanksgiving and symbolically, as the thanksgiving prayer of all Israel for Christ's fulfillment of God's promise of redemption. Following Mary's song of praise the text of the Doxology spans the final two movements of the work.
