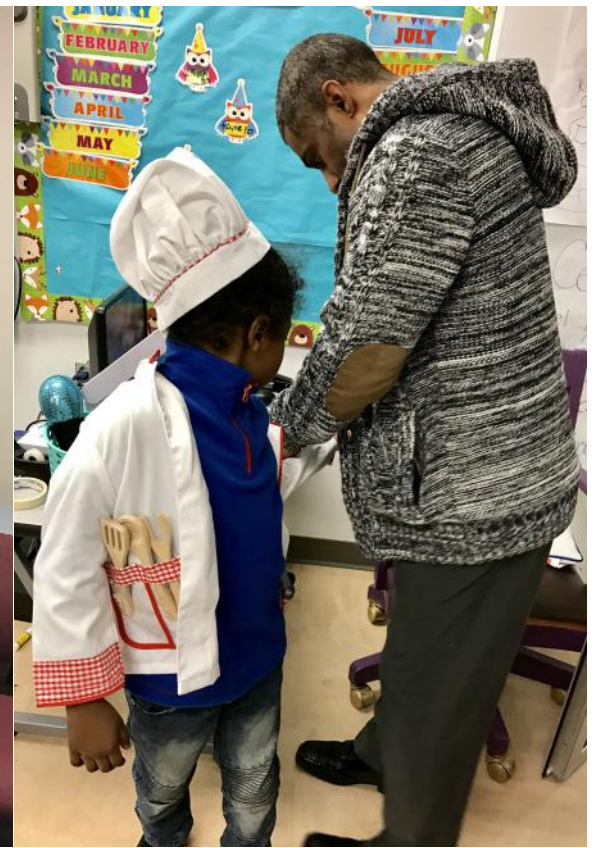

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### Prayers of Thanksgiving!

Praise be to God for the response of the congregation to the budget shortfall. The ESL Coordinator position has now been funded, and has been filled by Debra Miller. Debra and her family have been attending our church for approximately two years. She has been volunteering in our ESL program for one year. Debra brings with her experience in education and church work. Debra is passionate about her calling to this position. We welcome Debra to our staff!

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### Prayers for Wisdom:

Pray for the wisdom of deacons and committee members to discern God's will in how to utilize the remaining Missions budget most effectively, both in Community Mission Deacons and in World Mission. These committees are tasked with sending out most of our missions funding into the world to support various mission work and ministries of the church. The budget shortfall has hit those two committees hardest, with the exception of ESL losing the ability to provide childcare for participants.

## Missions Event Planning

Ah, event planning! It can be stressful. In order to help your Missions event go smoothly at the church, please come see me. **Early meetings with me in the first stages of planning an event can help the process to be fun!**

Other staff members and I have put together an event planning form, formerly known as the “orange form” or the “room reservation form.” This form encompasses all that the old orange form did, while adding new elements for clarity, organization, and planning. It is still orange for continuity. :-)

**Using this form, I can help you plan your event and all of the PR that goes along with it. I will then get the completed form copied for you and distributed to staff. A copy stays at Marcia’s desk in a planning folder, so anyone can grab it at a moment’s notice to determine the details of your event to help the event go well.**

Please keep in mind when planning an event that you will need time. First, one must determine a funding stream. In these days of budget cuts, there aren’t many options of extra funds to support all events. As such, **unless there is a committee voting to use the existing expense account associated with the committee, please don’t assume that money is going to be available to use for the purpose of your event.** Also, please keep in mind that we need to work around existing events. You may not be able to have the first choice of date, time or room location, especially with late planning, as other events or building use may already be planned before your event idea was initiated. **Planning with staff is essential.** Also, depending on the time of the events, the facilities budget can begin to become stressed when extra manpower is needed to cover the events (preparation work, cleaning up, etc). This is something of which to be mindful.

Staff is initiating again a planning meeting to put events on the calendar early. We had our first one in August of 2017, and will have another one this month for 2017. Please attend these meetings or send information to me in your absence. **If you have any missions events you are considering for your group, I would love to sit down with a representative of your group, or the group itself, to get the ball rolling and to help make the event as effortless as possible.**
