### **OUR COMMUNITY**

#### **Restoration Urban Ministries**

Ervin Williams, Executive Director of Restoration Urban Ministries (RUM), reported on the state of the ministry in RUM's March newsletter. Some highlights are:

- 1. RUM finished 2015 in the **black** rather than the red!
  - 2. Building A is now completely renovated.
- 3. Plans are to renovate Building B that houses half of the residents. Currently, there are 123 residents. Estimate for the repairs is around \$10,000.
  Volunteers are needed to finish the projects, and work is expected to start by June. Groups are welcome to sponsor rooms or help with a project.
  Just let RUM know of your desire to help.
  - 4. There is an urgent need for the following items:

    \*Resident Needs: crock pots, microwaves,

    refrigerators, Twin and Full sheet sets, shower rods,

    shower liners, toiletries for men and women

    (shampoo, body wash, razors, deodorant, etc.)

    \*Organizational Needs: wire shelving (closet type),

    dressers and chest of drawers, donations to repair

    resident room heat/air units (\$160 per room), heavy

    duty carpet shampooer, bagless vacuum cleaners

    (new or gently used), coin operated

    washer and dryer.
  - 5. RUM is in need of sponsors to help residents complete a GED. The cost is \$150 per student, which includes both the test and the preparation materials.

# CANAAN

S.A.F.E.HOUSE I have been visiting with our Community Mission agencies this year, and will continue to do so throughout the year, visiting with

Community Mission Deacons (CMD) whenever possible. After visiting CANAAN S.A.F.E. HOUSE several weeks ago with the CMD, Don Fischer, an exciting development occurred. Since grant monies for classes are now gone, the program is in need of self-development classes for the residents. Because of my background as an undergraduate psychology teacher, I was asked if I could teach academic psychology concepts which would relate to long term recovery for the residents. S.A.F.E. House leadership and I are working together to develop a short positive psychology course for the residents and staff. The course is planned to occur at our church over the course of four weeks this spring.

If you have skills or concepts you would like the opportunity to teach for the self-development of S.A.F.E. House residents, please let me know. Topics related to getting a job are particularly in need (resume writing, applying for jobs, interviewing skills, etc.).

S.A.F.E. House was created in partnership between Canaan Baptist Church and First Presbyterian Church of Champaign in the 1990s as a Christ-centered program to help those struggling with addiction to recover. Twenty-five percent of our CMD funds this year go to S.A.F.E. House.

#### Dear Kristi:

Please thank the congregation of First Presbyterian for their very generous gift of \$939. Words can't express how vital this donation is to the Refugee Center. The current fiscal situation within the state means that the Center must increasingly rely upon your gifts to fulfill our mission to aid in the resettlement and assimilation of immigrants and refugees in East Central Illinois.

We have compiled our figures for the first half of FY16 (July – December) and we served over 1600 unduplicated individuals which was up almost 18% for the same period last year. We also are continuing to serve a growing number unaccompanied minors who were relocated to the area by the Office of Refugee Resettlement. Currently we have at least 35 unaccompanied minors within the area.

The Saturday Morning Tutoring Program resumed October 3<sup>rd</sup> with approximately 40 students and an equal number of tutors. The first semester we had two students from an education class introduce our students to money and the concepts such of wants and needs, budgets, and waiting versus instant gratification. Everyone needs to understand these concepts to be a better money manager.

Our annual fundraising dinner is scheduled for April 16th, 2016. The day after normal tax day. Hope to see you there.

The goals of the seminar are to increase physical, mental, and spiritual awareness of internal conflicts within pilots/mechanics and their spouses, to assist in reducing possible risks to safe operations, and support Christian discipleship of individuals within each person's sphere of influence.

We pray that we will be an encouragement to MAF staff living and serving Christ in remote regions of Africa.
