Pastor Nominating Committee Update

The Pastor Nominating Committee continues the work of evaluating, researching, and interviewing candidates for the next Head Pastor/Chief of Staff at First Presbyterian Church. In addition to our regular weekly meetings on Sunday afternoons, the committee meets throughout the week (as needed) to plan and conduct candidate interviews. Committee members have participated in these meetings by telephone when vacations, family events, or work commitments have taken them out of town this summer. While the past few months have been extremely busy, an atmosphere of trust, friendship, and openness has kept the PNC working smoothly.

For comparably-sized PC(USA) congregations, it is not unusual for the PNC process to take three years to complete. (We just passed the two-year mark in July.) We were very close to the final stage of the search with two candidates this summer, but both withdrew from consideration (one for family reasons and the other for an opportunity to teach and lead outside of a pastoral call). While these results were disappointing, they are a reminder that however great a candidate is in our eyes, and however great First Presbyterian is in their eyes, if the timing is not right at that particular moment, then the call to our pulpit just was not meant to be and God is pointing us in another direction.

In addition to finding someone who is comfortable leading a congregation and staff as large as ours, we are also looking for:

Part of our History

Work continues on the restoration of the stained glass windows and the wood trim surrounding each window. An historic color analysis was performed on samples that were taken when getting down to the base layer. In keeping with historical tradition, this color has been specified for the new trim paint...a deep hunter green.

If you look at the Church History book, the photos taken before 1950 or so show a dark color trim on the windows. It is believed that when the secondary storm windows were installed, the wood frames were painted white.

The white paint was identified as lead containing material. The contractors are following a specification using the EPA standards for lead removal when stripping the paint. 
Got Photos?

Sunday School Update

Our Sunday morning worship schedule is changing., and with it, our education hour is changing a little too. Children will still report to the education building to checkin for the morning and receive a name tag. Children who arrive between 8:45 and 9 AM will have the option to enter the chapel and help with a mission project. Children in preschool and younger will proceed to their classroom for their lesson. At 9 AM, Middle School students will also proceed to their classroom.

Please prayerfully consider if you would be able to give two Sundays a month or more toward teaching an age group of our children.

Our first youth collaboration event will be September 24 at 5 PM . We will have some community building games and food. Financial Update



Contributions


Contributions in August were \$6K more than 2016 but \$19K below the budget at \$53K. The Year-to-Date total exceeded last year by \$8K but is below the budgeted amount by \$7K. The increase in this year's contributions continues to offset the decrease in prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the pledge year) for 2017 compared to 2016 but the contributions have dropped below the amount budgeted for the year. These prepaid pledges are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions.

Expenses

Year-to-Date expenses are \$36K below budget at \$633K and \$40K below 2016. Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$42K which is \$52K better than at this time in 2016. This figure includes a \$29K transfer from other funds that was not made last year.
