Care for Creation with Local Food

Did you know that the food we eat travels over 1,500 miles before it ends up on our plate? This is regardless of whether the food is organic or conventional. One way to reduce pollution is to buy food locally. We are blessed to have options to buy fresh veggies and fruit right here in the C-U area. Of course, there are wonderful farmer's markets where one can buy locally produced foods. There is another option as well: Community Supported Agriculture (CSA).

CSA farmers sell "shares." These funds provide the supplies and staff to grow food. Also, in return, investors receive many weeks of produce. Share costs vary, but typically are between \$200 and \$500 per season. You go home with the bounty of the week and have fresh, nutritious produce. Everyone wins...the earth, your taste buds, and the farmer!
