Join Pastor Matt and other interested members of our church to visit Kemmerer Village. Kemmerer Village is a ministry supported through our World Mission budget.

Kemmerer Village began as a orphanage more than 100 years ago. Currently young people (teenagers) who have been abused, neglected and/or placed there by courts, live in cottages on the site and receive educational services, counseling, recreational activities etc. Kemmerer also works in the foster care system and provides foster care workers.

More than 100 churches support Kemmerer Village. Other funding streams come through the Department of Children and Family Services Our church has supported it for many years. John Seiler, Jim Andrews and Chuck Meece are all past members of the board of directors. Currently Steve Gritten and Katharine Jones serve on the board.

A trip is in the works for May 2nd. The plan is to ride in the church van and/or carpool. The trip takes about 1.5 hours of drive time each way and is an easy drive. Members will leave the church at 9am and return to the church at about 5pm.

The day's events will include a tour of the campus, lunch in the cafeteria (no charge), and an explanation of the equine therapy program.
