Revisiting the Sunday Morning Schedule

Dear Friends:

Before I arrived, your Session promised the congregation to revisit the Sunday morning schedule in January 2018. We have prayerfully been working on the schedule, as promised. **Pat Metcalf, Karin Vermillion, John Muirhead**, and **Judi Geistlinger** were appointed to lead the Session's discussions. That ad hoc committee met beginning in February, and they have led the Session through conversations in April and May. The Session will vote on a proposed schedule change (it's really a tweak) at its June stated meeting.

At the request of our Children, Youth, and Families Committee, and with the full blessing of our Worship Committee, the Session is contemplating a tweaked schedule that will include roughly one hour of the Sunday morning schedule dedicated to church-wide Christian education. The worship times do not change, with the exception of The Gathering being nudged from 11:00 to 11:15 (or 11:10).

This new schedule will prevail upon our dedicated Transportation Team to get folk to church in time to check in for the 9:00 Traditional Service, then drive folk home after Church School ends at 11:05. **John Muirhead** assures me that the demands on the Transportation Team with the proposed new schedule will be roughly the same as the old. In the case of any Sunday schedule, thanks be to God for this dedicated team.

Both CYF and Worship teams will create dedicated space for our children to sit together at the 9:00 Traditional Worship Service. This will allow parents, if they wish, to worship without their children in the pew next to them. "Pew Buddies," teachers, 'adoptive grandparents,' and other adult friends will be secured to sit with our children who attend whose parents choose to sit elsewhere or who attend without parents. Worship bags will be treasure troves of learning for our youngest friends.

Please pray for your Session as they contemplate our life together on Sunday mornings. As impossible as it is, they want to make everybody happy. So, share with them your thoughts, but thank them for their work and pray for them.

Our Worship Committee will work on ways to include children in all aspects of worship as appropriate. On Pentecost, you may have noticed a teenager collecting the offering. Occasionally, you'll notice an exuberant child singing with the adult choir. Children and grandchildren often assist 'their adults' in doing the hallowed chores of greeting guests, picking up friendship registers, and ringing the church bell. With more children in worship, more children will be participating. The "family of God" will be less divided at 9:00 under the new schedule. With the current schedule, our children are present for only 10-minutes and the full experience of worship is something they don't get to have.

Karin Vermillion, on behalf of the ad hoc schedule team, lifted up some key concerns and goals addressed by the proposed schedule change thusly:

Children, Youth, and Families

- Allows for a full hour of Sunday School for all ages
- > Allows for deeper spiritual enrichment through universal, multigenerational participation in worship
- Creates a unique opportunity to make connections between people of different cultures, through formation of pew partner relationships
- > Prepares children for "adult" participation in church life
- Frees volunteers who wish to teach Sunday School AND attend 9:00 worship, helping us to uphold our baptismal vows

Worship

- Maintains all three established Sunday services
- > Encourages increased participation in 9:00 liturgy

Music

- > Exposes children to the Church's rich musical tradition
- Simplified transportation schedule and full class-time hour could allow flexibility for scheduling children's

choir, including separating choir by age group (TBD)

Facilities

- > Maintains current ease of set up
- Allows for possibility of future combining of 8:00 & 9:00 services, which would make bad weather mornings easier

Adult Spiritual Formation

- Extension of "hour" between services adds to adult education time
- Maintains option to attend adult education class and either traditional or contemporary worship

Transportation

- ➤ Simplifies schedule all children will arrive at 8:55, and be dismissed at 11:05
- Maintains drivers' ability to attend 9:00 worship and adult education or volunteer with children
- Promotes formation of cross-cultural relationships leading to increased attendance at both Saturday evening and Sunday morning worship services

Please pray for your Session as they contemplate our life together on Sunday mornings. As impossible as it is, they want to make everybody happy. So, share with them your thoughts, but thank them for their work and pray for them.

My experience of Sundays is that these days do not breathe Sabbath rest. Instead, they are absolutely jammed. So many of our people are practically jogging from one thing to the next. Our staggered-start Sunday school program divides us and appears untenable, exhausting, and unsustainable. The proposed schedule, while not perfect, is doable. Allowing children to fully participate in Traditional Worship—which the current schedule does not allow—electrifies me.

May the God of all time and space continue to bless and guide us as we strive to be good stewards of God's holy time.

Financial Update




Contributions


Contributions in May were \$6K more than in 2017 but \$22K below the budget at \$49K. The Year to Date total is below last year by \$23K but is above the budgeted amount by \$3K. These figures include prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the budget year) that are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions.

Expenses

Year to Date expenses are \$16K above budget at \$441K and above 2017 by \$23K. Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$52K which is \$23K less than at the end of May in 2017. This figure includes \$48K more in prepaid pledges than in 2017.







Benevolence Fund

Our congregation is both financially blessed and financially diverse where many brothers and sisters face short term financial emergencies beyond their capacity.

Our Benevolence Fund is supported by individual gifts from members of the congregation. It is an emergency fund to help with rent, utilities, food and medicine when other assistance is not available. Applications are reviewed by a committee of three members appointed by our pastors. In general, a family must have a significant relationship with our congregation and can receive help only once a year for no more that \$500. Vendors are paid directly on behalf of recipients.

You can help maintain the fund with a donation to our Church with a memo: "benevolence fund". Should you have emergency needs you may talk to a pastor. Applications are available at www.firstpres.church under "resources/forms". All requests are confidential.
