### **Door System Upgraded**

A new door system is being installed for the church and education buildings. Our previous system locked and unlocked doors at odd times, thus the immediate need for a new door system. ### **Financial Update**

#### **Contributions**

Contributions in December were \$5K less than in 2017 but \$26K above the budget at \$97K. The Year to Date total is below last year by \$20K and below the budgeted amount by \$10K. These figures include prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the budget year) that are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions. Including all revenue sources we have received \$962K which is \$20K below budget and 98% of the expected 2018 revenue.


#### **Expenses**


Year to Date expenses are \$15K below the budget at \$1,005K but more than in 2017 by \$36K. Considering all sources, expenses exceed revenue by \$43K which is \$66K more than at the end of 2017 and \$5K more than budgeted. At the conclusion of the year we have experienced 98.5% of the expected 2018 expenses.


### Stewardship

Our congregation's response to the stewardship drive this year has been overwhelming. A total of 186 pledges have been received for the 2019 operating budget totaling \$793,686. This compares with a total of \$699,427 from 161 pledges last year. More than one-half of all respondents increased their pledge this year over last, including 44 who made commitments this year who did not last year.

Thank you to all who have made the choice to participate in the financial stability of our church. This allows us to continue our programs furthering God's work in our community and beyond.


### What's on the horizon for the First Pres ESL Program?
