Hymn notes: The Church's One Foundation is our sturdy opening hymn; expect a wide-open, dynamic organ and (I hope) lots of strong singing. Written in England at the close of the American Civil War, the lyric serves as a needed reminder of what is at the center of the Christian faith: Jesus Christ. This sentiment is echoed in our closing hymn, the gospel favorite Standing on the Promises. Former Baptists and southerners-at-heart may especially resonate with this robust song. We are singing a fourth hymn this Sunday, Fairest Lord Jesus (known in other circles as Beautiful Savior) as the response to the sermon. Our middle hymn lyric is the refreshingly newest of the standard (and old) others, When Memory Fades; as we gather for our annual congregational meeting, we remember our past. This hymn makes note of brothers and sisters for whom memory has betrayed them. The tune is a memorable, old chestnut.
